
LOCAL LIVING

Whether you're drawn to the stunning natural landscapes, the outdoor recreational opportunities, or the friendly community, moving to Coeur d'Alene is an exciting venture. CLIMATE

North Idaho is a four season climate. The summers are usually short, warm, dry, and mostly clear. The hot season lasts for 2.7 months, from June 21 to September 12, with an average daily high temperature above 76°F. The hottest day of the year is August 3, with an average high of 86°F and low of 56°F. The winters are cold and mostly cloudy.

Over the course of the year, the temperature typically varies from 24°F to 86°F and is rarely below 9°F or above 95°F. The cold season lasts for 3.5 months, from November 13 to February 26, with an average daily high temperature below 44°F. The coldest day of the year is January 1, with an average low of 24°F and high of 34°F.



OUTDOOR LIFESTYLE



FISHING

The large lakes all have large trout salmonid fisheries; in Lake Pend Oreille, gerrard-strain rainbow. Priest Lake has similarly large mackinaw trout and Coeur d'Alene Lake has an impressive chinook salmon fishery. But that barely describes the fishing opportunities; around the region's lakes and streams. There are prolific fisheries of rainbow, cutthroat and brook trout, largemouth and smallmouth bass, pike and walleye.



HUNTING

For hunters, North Idaho's vast forests and remote wild lands provide excellent hunting for most of the continent's major big game species, including white-tailed and mule deer, Rocky Mountain elk, moose, mountain goat, black bear, mountain lion and gray wolf. Waterfowl and upland bird hunting is also popular. Major species include quail, grouse, pheasant, goose, duck, coot and snipe. There is small game hunting for rabbit and hare as well.



SKIING

Three different ski resorts are located within relatively easy reach of Coeur d' Alene, with two of them being among the largest ski areas that Idaho has to offer.

Schweitzer Mountain Resort

Located to the north of the county seat, the ski resort is just outside Sandpoint with views of Lake Pend Oreille on a good day. The total of ten lifts includes eight chairlifts of varying capacities and the area offers 92 trails, with half of them being classed as advanced or expert.

Silver Mountain Resort

Easily reached along the I-90 and near the town of Kellogg, the ski area is a favorite of powder skiers and is known for its lack of crowds. Silver Mountain has seven lifts, including a gondola from Kellogg itself, and the terrain covers 1600 acres.

Lookout Pass

Straddles the border between Idaho and Montana on the crest of the Bitterroot range of mountains and claims an average of 400 inches of snowfall per year. The small ski area offers four chairlifts covering just over 500 acres of terrain (scheduled to double with a new ski expansion in the future).
