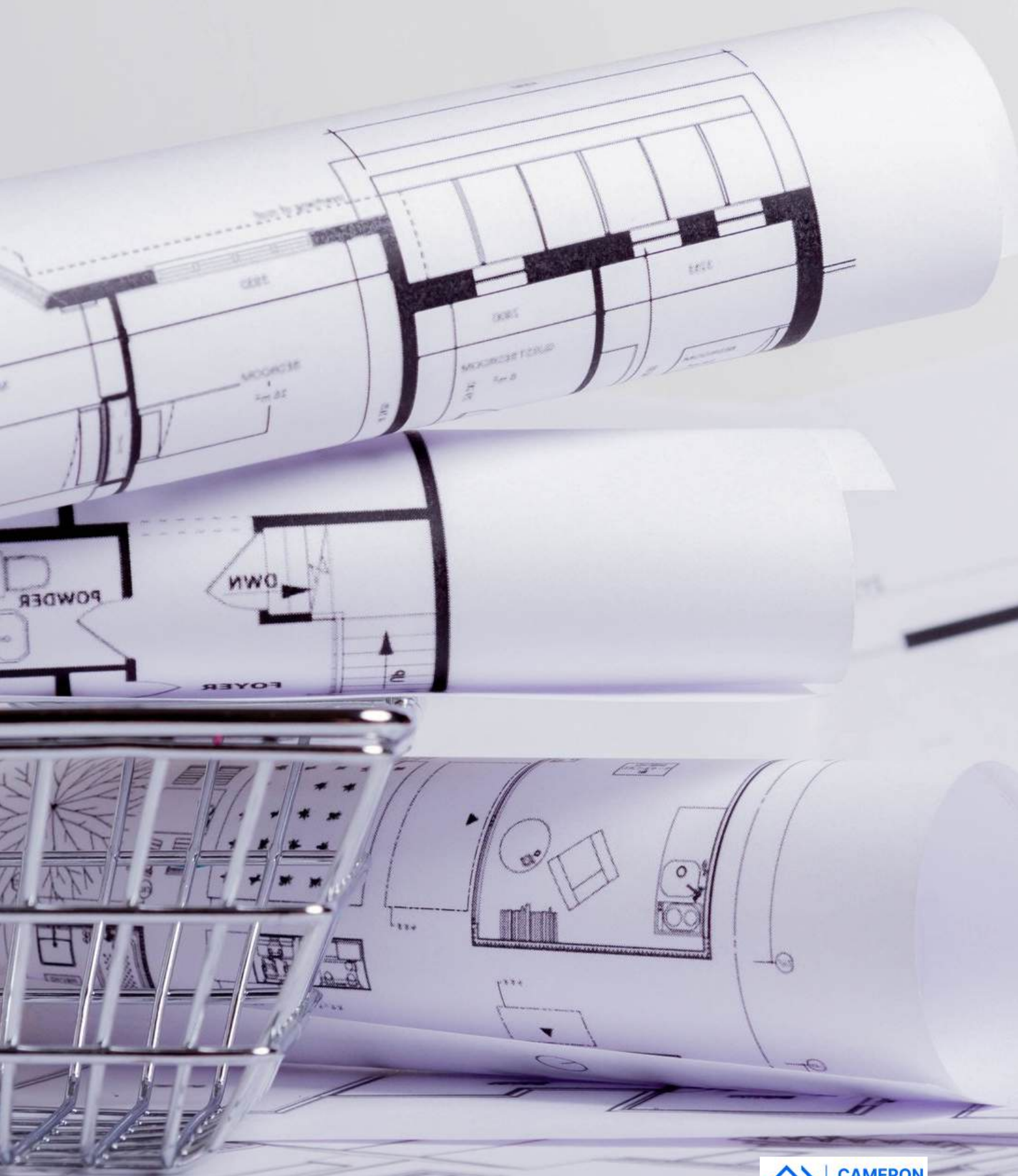

Building Your Timeline

- **2-3 Months Out:**

Start researching neighborhoods and agents. Visit homes virtually or in person when possible.

- **6-8 Weeks Out:**

Secure your housing, choose movers, and begin decluttering.

- **1 Month Out:**

Notify schools, doctors, and banks of the address change. Schedule utility transfers and mail forwarding.

- **2-3 Weeks Out:**

Pack non-essentials, confirm moving date, and book a cleaning service for your old home.

- **Moving Week:**

Pack essentials, confirm utility connections at your new Huntsville address, and say your goodbyes.

Utilities & Services Setup

- **Electricity:** Huntsville Utilities
- **Water/Sewer:** Huntsville Utilities or Madison County Water Authority (for outlying areas)
- **Natural Gas:** Huntsville Utilities
- **Internet/Cable:** Xfinity, AT&T, Google Fiber, and others
- **Trash/Recycling:** Set up through your municipality

Each provider may require a deposit and may offer different appointment lead times. Schedule at least two weeks ahead!
