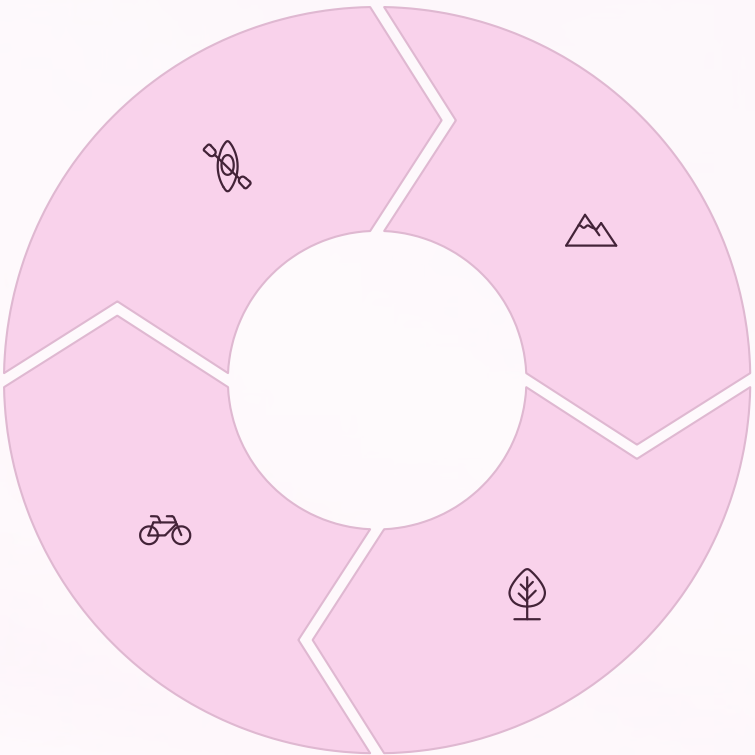

Climate Benefits

Seattle's temperate maritime climate means moderate temperatures year-round. Summers are spectacular—sunny, dry, and typically 70-80°F—perfect for outdoor festivals, concerts, and adventures. Winters are mild (40-50°F) with drizzle rather than downpours, and snow is rare in the city proper.

This climate eliminates the extremes found elsewhere: no oppressive heat waves, no frigid winters requiring heavy snow removal, and no hurricane or tornado seasons. The famous rainfall is actually less annual precipitation than New York or Miami, it's just distributed across more days with lighter, misty rain.
