Tip: Stay objective by sticking to your budget and making a list of must-haves and deal-breakers. This will help keep your emotions in check during the decision-making process.

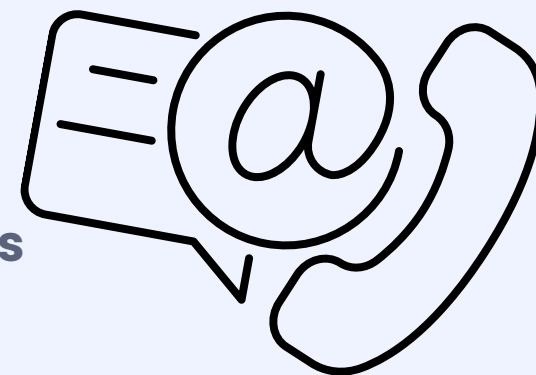
